Caitlyn Fischer was a much-loved Gippsland Grammar Old Scholar and was one of the first students to enrol at the then new Bairnsdale Campus in 2006. During her 10 years at Gippsland Grammar. On April 26 Principal David Baker and Bairnsdale Head of Campus Virginia Evans opened 'Caitlyn's Garden' in Bairnsdale's Early Learning Centre, alongside Caitlyn's parents Mark and Ailsa and her brother, Kristofer.

The natural play space has been designed to provide a place for play, for curiosity, reflection, for sensory and tactile exploration and imagination. The centrepiece of the garden is a wooden statue of Caitlyn's beloved horse Ralphie, by acclaimed local wood sculptor John Brady.
